During the last legislative session the House Body was made up of 76 Republicans and 74 Democrats. Too Close for Comfort! Linda Harper-Brown House, Dist. 105, won her race by 19 votes, which is Way Too Close. Those 19 votes determined the Majority in the Texas House. This election year we must actively campaign in more of the Texas House races to win 10 seats back from the Democrats. This would mean the next House would be composed of 86 Republicans and 64 Democrats.

Focus on Incumbents:

- ✓ Texas House District 11 Representative, CHUCK HOPSON was a Democrat in the last legislative session but a long time conservative leader. While in the legislature, he has supported the right to keep and bear arms, co-authoring the Castle Doctrine legislation, helped pass patient rights laws, worked for reforms against lawsuit abuse, and passed the bill to add “One State Under God” to the Pledge to the Texas Flag. He supports photo voter ID, stronger border security DPS operations, death penalty, and many other conservative policies. After disagreeing with the liberal views of the Democratic Party, Rep. Hopson joined the Republican Party in 2009 because his ideology is in line with our conservative values. We welcome this small business owner, avid hunter, fisherman and Lifetime member of the NRA & Texas State Rifle Association.
- ✓ Texas House District 32 Representative, TODD HUNTER is a strong conservative elected from an area that includes Aransas, Calhoun and San Patricio Counties and part of Nueces County. While this area has the tendency to vote Democratic, Todd worked hard to win his seat and we need to protect this representative. Rep. Hunter received the "Best of the House" Legislative Award given by the Combined Law Enforcement Associations of Texas (CLEAT) for Rep. Hunter's support of Law Enforcement during the 81st Legislative Session. He opposes tax increases on hard working Texans. He supports making our border more secure. Todd is a loyal TFRW friend that displays wise decision making as a legislator.
- ✓ Texas House District 105 Representative LINDA HARPER BROWN represents a portion of Dallas County. She is a strong conservative and believes that elected representatives must be held accountable. To keep legislators from using anonymous voice votes to hide their actions from their constituents back home, Linda helped pass a bill that required every vote in the Texas House to be officially recorded and made public. She also is pushing for tougher laws to stop illegal immigration and better secure our borders, including legislation that will allow local law enforcement to arrest illegal aliens and assist with their deportation. She has worked to improve the transportation system of Texas and to improve the educational system in her district. We will all benefit by supporting Linda in her House Race.
- ✓ Texas House District 138 Representative DWAYNE BOHAC has been targeted by the Democratic Party. He was named to the Texas PTA's statewide Legislative Honor Roll for his leadership in public education during the 81st Session. He supports excellence in education by promoting a return to educational basics, supporting the practice of discipline in the classroom, working to reward good teachers and encouraging parents to take responsibility for their children's education. He also believes we need smaller, more efficient government, strong action to secure our borders, lower taxes to encourage economic growth and job creation. He opposes foreign company ownership of Texas roads. Dwayne's district is in Harris County where we do not want to lose any ground.
- ✓ Texas House District 144 Representative KEN LEGLER serves a southeastern part of Houston, Pasadena and an unincorporated portion of Harris County. He grew up in his district and is a businessman keenly aware that common sense has an important place in the development of governmental regulations. He believes in free-market reforms to improve our healthcare system and opposed a socialized medical system. He supports photo id requirements in voting, additional border security and balanced government budgets. Ken faces a tough race and we must help him with volunteer hours and financial contributions.
