

Theresa Kosmoski, President We Make It Happen!

It may say "summer" on the calendar, but there is so much going on and so much that we are doing during this important Presidential Election year..... we cannot do it without you.

One of the highlights of my summer was being asked to speak at the Donald Trump rally in The Woodlands. While the convention center only held around 6,000, nearly 20,000 people braved a heat index of 103 degrees to hear the Republican nominee speak. Our own Toni Anne Dashiell was also on hand to speak and between the two of us, TFRW got some really good PR. Plus, it was a fun event, the number of Secret Service agents notwithstanding.

At the July 9th Board of Directors meeting, all District Directors were give a flash drive of great importance. The RPT provided us with a list of "new movers" into or around Texas who are likely Republican voters. They further refined this massive list to a bit over 100,000 names, comprised only of women, all of whom are likely Republicans.

Each District Director was given this flash drive, narrowed to the "new movers" in her Senatorial District. She will further refine the list geographically and give each club in her district a list of the names most likely near that club.

Clubs: there are two very important things that I need you to do with the list:

- Use it as a voter registration tool. Send letters with voter registration forms, hold a
 picnic or rally or voter drive and invite these "new movers", send your deputized
 voter registrars to knock on doors if that works in your area. Make contact and get
 them registered....we need all hands on deck if we are to have a sweeping Republican
 victory in Texas and across the country.
- **2.** Use it as a membership tool. Mine the list for new members this list is ENTIRELY WOMEN....likely R's.....perfectly primed to join our clubs and help your club make

100% of the "One More" challenge. Send them invitations to a CHAT or another fun summer event that your club may be doing, or to your first fall meeting. Perhaps buy them lunch at your meeting, or offer a special discount for membership.

This list is worth its weight in platinum; we must use it and make the absolute most out of it that we can.

Remember, it will take all of us pulling together and bringing in others if we are to take the White House, preserve our majority in Congress, protect the integrity of the Supreme Court and keep Texas a red state.

It is up to us; there is no one else who can do the job. America needs us. Future generations are depending on us. We cannot let them down.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

I don't know about you, but every year as we approach Independence Day, my interest in the Congress reaches a peak. After all, our Founders declared independence chiefly so that government would be closer to the people, and it feels like a duty to pay attention when one considers what they put on the line to ensure our right to do so. Congress is in session through July 15 in Washington, and you have probably heard a little about what's been happening (big topics have included gun control legislation and the 2017 defense appropriations bill). But with a lot going on at the local level, it can be difficult to glean information about federal activity from traditional news sources.

To follow Congress more closely, follow these tips (and share them with your club members!):

- Learn About the Process and Find Specific Bills https://www.congress.gov/ is home to the Library of Congress, where you can find current and historic information on legislation. This is a great resource, too, if you want to find out more about the federal legislative process. It is easy to view on a mobile device, and if you have an iPhone or an iPad, you can get a free app called "The Congressional Record," maintained by the Library of Congress, to follow specific pieces of federal legislation.
- ➤ Sign Up for Updates Once you've located your Congressman's official website, sign up to receive updates by email. You'll want to do this even if you are represented by a Democrat, so you can get information about what is happening in the Capitol directly from the source. Individual committees may also have email updates available through their pages (for example, the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs is located at http://veterans.house.gov/). Speaker Paul Ryan has a newsletter available through http://www.speaker.gov/. Senate information is all available through http://www.senate.gov.
- Legislative Calendar You can find the House calendar here: http://www.house.gov/legislative/. Majority Leader Kevin McCarthy also has information on what's scheduled to be heard daily, weekly, and so forth here: http://www.majorityleader.gov/floor/. For the Senate, all links can be found on the front page at http://www.senate.gov (look on the right hand side for the calendar link). You can find video archives for both chambers here: https://www.congress.gov/
- ➤ **C-SPAN** C-SPAN airs live proceedings in the House and Senate, and often airs committee hearings of interest as well. Check your local cable listings, or go to http://www.c-span.org.
- ➤ Caucuses, Outside Organizations, News Sources The Republican Study Committee is led by Texas Congressman Bill Flores (CD-17), and you can get information from this caucus at http://rsc.flores.house.gov. Outside organizations such as https://www.govtrack.us/ also keep up with legislation. NFRW sends out occasional action alerts and updates on legislation (make sure your email address is up-to-date with TFRW!) and groups like Americans for Prosperity, National Taxpayers Union, and others send out regular updates on their priority legislation. Non-partisan websites such as http://www.thehill.com publish news stories daily on Congressional activity.

Bank Account Basics

Whether you are a New Treasurer opening a New Bank Account or an Experienced Treasurer changing Bank Accounts, navigating the maze of financial institution requirements can sometimes be a challenge. What documents do TFRW Clubs need to open a Bank Account?

Keep in mind that different Banks and Credit Unions may have slightly different requirements; however, here is a basic list of the documents you will need.

- IRS Letter Confirming Federal Employer Identification Number (EIN)
- TFRW Club By-laws
- TFRW Club Meeting Minutes indicating election of Authorized Officers
- Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) Letter Confirming Committee Account Name & Number

It is important to obtain a Federal Employer Identification Number (EIN) for your club. This EIN will be used to open your Bank Account. If your club does not currently have an EIN, you will need to submit Form SS-4, Application for Employer Identification Number (EIN), to the IRS.

The Bank Account Name should be the full TFRW Club Name (and also the TEC Committee Name). Authorized check signers will need to be present at the financial institution and provide a Photo ID, Social Security Number and additional identifying information. This is also necessary when authorized check signers change due to officer elections, resignations or other circumstances.

It may be helpful to call or stop by your financial institution and ask about their specific requirements before you officially open a Bank Account.

Our Country's 240th Anniversary On July 4th, 2016 our great Nation will celebrate its 240th Anniversary. It is with great pride that our flag will be flying everywhere across the United States representing Freedom and Democracy. On July 27th the flag should be flown at half-staff until sunset signifying the end of the Korean War in 1952.

July / August Important Dates: The U.S. Army Air corps was established July 2, 1926 and Air Force Day is August 1st. On August 4, 1790 the Coast Guard was established. The first Purple Heart was established on August 7, 1782 by General George Washington to honor those soldiers who fought in the Continental Army during the American Revolution. Sergeant Daniel Bissell received his badge for spying on British troops quartered in New York City and then returning to American lines with invaluable intelligence. After the Revolution the Washington's Badge of Military Merit fell into disuse for almost 150 years. General Black Jack Pershing and the American Expeditionary Force revived the use of Medals and Congress passed legislation creating the Distinguished Service Cross. Audie Murphy of Hunt County, Texas was the most decorated soldier of WWII, receiving every Medal of Valor awarded. Honoring those individuals in our clubs and communities who have been recipients of military awards would be an excellent theme for meetings during July.

Heroes in History: On July 3, 1775 George Washington took Command of the Continental Army at Cambridge, Massachusetts. The Continental Congress issued orders to General Washington and his Generals under his command. To help finance this endeavor Benjamin Franklin spent a great deal of his time in France to finance and obtain funds for the Continental Army. This was a delicate situation as France did not want to again go to war against the British. One of the most famous Naval officers was John Paul Jones (1747-1792) and was best remembered for responding "I have yet begun to fight!" to British opponents seeking his surrender during a naval battle. The flag flying from on board his ship was the Grand Union Flag. The 6th President of the United States was John Adams. He was the first President to be preceded by his father. Adams first began his career in diplomacy as the U.S. ambassador to the Netherlands and then later to Prussia and Great Britain. As Secretary of State under President James Monroe he helped to develop the Monroe Doctrine. Admiral Farragut born July 5, 1801 in Knoxville, Tennessee was best known for yelling to the opposition during the Civil War "Damn the torpedoes, full speed ahead." It was during this war that battle ships were changed forever with the introduction of the ironclads the Merrimack and the Monitor. The Confederate States of America also had a mini sub called the H.L. Hunley. Amelia Earhart was the first woman to get a pilot's license from the National Aeronautic Association in 1923.
