It is a remarkable political year. The Texas primaries were pushed back to the Memorial holiday, and our runoffs will now occur in the heat of summer. And once we turn the calendar to August, it will be less than 100 days until Election Day. That is just 14 weeks away, and in politics, that is both a lifetime and a sprint. We need to be unified in the coming days and weeks.

What this means essentially is this: it's going to be a busy summer. If you love our state and country, and care deeply about our children's future, there is much work to do.

For perspective, Barack Obama is seeking re-election after nationalizing health care, exploding the deficit and our national debt, massively growing government in the name of jobs and taking us down the path of a wrong-headed and aimless foreign policy that emboldens our adversaries.

We are the largest red state in America because Republican women got to work more than two decades ago and built a new majority. I experienced the difference TFRW makes, winning my own election to the Texas House by two votes! All the time Republican women put into that race became the platform by which I eventually won statewide office, first as your agriculture commissioner, and now as your comptroller.

But as the population of Texas expands more rapidly than any other state, and we experience tremendous demographic change, we can't assume our own majority is etched in stone, nor can we ignore the impact a runaway federal government has on our state. The federal mismanagement of Medicaid alone will devastate state budgets, unless we change leadership in Washington.



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

By U.S. Senator John Cornyn (R-TX)

Control Of The U.S. Senate At Stake This November



Four years ago, the national political environment was a difficult one for Republicans. Liberal Democrats controlled not only the White House but both chambers of Congress as well, including a 60 seat super-majority in the U.S. Senate. We watched as promises of bipartisanship were quickly replaced with reckless spending, record debt and a refusal to listen to the voices of the American people.

Two years later, President Obama and Democratic leaders in Congress paid a price for their arrogant leadership as Republicans won back control of the House and seven seats in the Senate, including the President's own Senate seat in Illinois. We also successfully defended every single Republican Senate seat, including six open seats where the Republican Senator was retiring.

As Chairman of the National Republican Senatorial Committee, I was proud to help play a role in that effort, but I also recognized that our work was not over. With the support of my colleagues, I agreed to chair the NRSC for a second two-year term because this year's election is among the most important in our lifetimes and I wanted to continue to do my part to win back a Senate Republican majority.

While much of the political world's attention is on the Presidential race, it has never been more important to gain back a Republican Senate. A Senate Republican majority would not only put us in a position to fully repeal-and-replace ObamaCare, but it's also critical in the consideration of future Supreme Court nominees.

Remember that ObamaCare was passed on a purely party-line vote. Every single Senate Democratic incumbent on the ballot this November was the deciding vote to pass this bill, and the Senate races across America will be a referendum on this job-killing, national health care tax and the Democrats' reckless stewardship of our economy.

As Republicans, we seek smaller government, reasonable

tax and tort reform, an environment for businesses to grow, and an end to the wasteful, Washington spending that has driven our debt past previously-unimaginable levels.

Unlike much of the country, the Texas economy has been growing and families and small business owners have been flocking to Texas because our state's policies work. We need to make Washington look a little more like Texas, and it comes as no surprise to me that a group of bold Texan women is helping to lead the fight against the liberals in Washington.

The work and support provided to the party by the Texas Federation of Republican Women is indispensable to gaining a conservative Senate. Whether it's participating in making calls, serving as a Republican Party worker or contributing funds to Republican Senate candidates across the country, your participation this cycle will certainly help propel us towards victory this Fall.

While I have complete confidence that the Senate seat in our State held by the retiring Kay Bailey Hutchison will stay firmly in Republican hands, our Party faces competitive races across the country. Labor union bosses and far-left environmental groups are pouring money into our opponents' campaign coffers and the liberals are mobilizing because they see their grip on power in Washington quickly eroding.

I believe we will not just match, but exceed their efforts, and the recent Supreme Court decision on ObamaCare only further highlights the stakes involved this November.


