### **Conventions**

- A MAJOR function within the Party
- Precinct Convention
  - Each County determines when and where to be held
  - Must be AFTER polls close on March 1, 2022
- County/Senate District Convention March 26, 2022
  - County Convention if the County is entirely in ONE State
    Senate District
  - Senate District Convention if the County has more than one State Senate District
- State Convention June 16<sup>th</sup> 18<sup>th</sup> 2022 in Houston, TX

# **Purpose of Conventions**

• Elect Delegates and Alternates to attend the next convention level.

• Consider resolutions or statements on policy issues for possible inclusion into State Party Platform.

# Who can Participate?

- Registered voter in represented area
- Affiliated with the Republican Party
  - Voting in the 2022 Primary Election
  - Take Oath of Affiliation
    - ★ Cannot have voted in another party's Primary Election or participate in another party's convention process
- And has been elected to serve at a previous convention
  - Excluding Precinct Conventions

# Precinct Conventions



### **Time & Location**

- Reach out to your local County Party to find out:
  - o Date & Time
    - ➤ Do NOT start before the stated time!
  - Location
    - ▼ Do NOT change from the stated location!
  - Precinct Chair
    - ➤ If you DO have a precinct chair reach out to them in advance.
    - ➤ If you do NOT have a precinct chair you might be running the precinct convention!
- If you DO have a Precinct Chair they are the temporary Precinct Convention Chair

# **Paperwork**

- There should be a folder at your precinct convention location with the following items:
  - Precinct Convention Instructions
  - Precinct Convention Script
  - Exhibit A Precinct Convention Minutes
  - Exhibit B Precinct Convention Attendance and County/SD Delegate and Alternate Form
  - Exhibit C Passed Resolutions
  - Exhibit D Failed Resolutions
- If you do NOT have these items source them from TFRW website.



#### A. Call to Order

- o Temporary Convention Chair (Precinct Chair) Calls the meeting to order and state that a quorum is present.
  - \*Invocation
  - ★ \*US Pledge
  - ▼ \*Texas Pledge
- Appointment of Temporary Officers
  - Secretary
  - Sergeant-at-Arms if needed
  - Parliamentarian if needed



### B. Configure Number of Qualified Candidates

- All participates should sign in:
  - ▼ Exhibit B Precinct Convention Attendance and County/SD Delegate and Alternate Form
- Verify that everyone has affiliated with the Republican Party
- Announce how many qualified participants there are.

# C. Give an overview of the agenda and basic procedure



#### D. Election Permanent Officers

- Convention Chair
  - This person's position ends once they turn in the completed paperwork on this convention.
  - They do not replace the Precinct Chair elected in the Primary
    - NOTE: In 2022 they are elected in the primary runoff.
- Secretary
- If the races are contested hold elections and announce the winners.
- E. Announce the County/SD Convention time, date, & location



#### F. Hold Elections for Delegates & Alternates

- Fill the Delegates first
- Then fill the Alternates
- Two Methods
  - o One Slot at a time
    - If you have more people than slots this might be the best method
    - It will take more time to vote on each slot.
  - As a Slate
    - If you have more slots than people, this might be the easiest method.

NOTE: You do not have to be present to be elected as a Del/Alt!



#### G. Consideration of Resolutions Committee

- If there are any resolutions, you will consider them one at a time
  - Each resolution must be written
  - They may be debated and amended
- Resolutions that ARE adopted Exhibit C
  - It is a huge help if these are typed and sent in an editable format to your County/SD
- Resolutions NOT adopted Exhibit D



- Review ALL paperwork!!
  - Exhibit A Precinct Convention Minutes
  - Exhibit B Precinct Convention Attendance and County/SD Delegate and Alternate Form
  - Exhibit C Passed Resolutions
  - Exhibit D Failed Resolutions
- Make sure all documents are signed by the correct convention officers
- You must remain 30 minutes after adjournment for others to review the records.

# **Follow Through**

### Submit paperwork to your County Chair

- The Precinct Convention Chair MUST return, either electronically or in person, all original copies of all convention documents to the County Chair
  - **Within three days** or
  - \* Postmarked within two days of the convention
- The convention will not be valid.
  - **★** (Texas Election Code Sec. 174.027)

# Resolution Guidelines



# Resolutions

- Formal statement of expression of an opinion put before the assembly for adoption
- Must be offered by a Delegate
- May be discussed and/or debated
- Must be passed by the delegation before advanced to the next convention level
- May become part of the Party's Platform

# Senate District (SD) Convention

• NOTE: If you are holding a Senatorial District Convention, there are additional guidelines regarding selection of Delegates and Alternates to the State Convention

  - Registration
  - o Set up
  - o Tear down

- Refreshments

\*Must be a delegate

# **Pages**



- High school students are great resources
- Tasks
  - Assist at committee meetings
  - Act as a runner between the main convention and committees
- Can also assist with registration, set up and tear down

### **Appoint Temporary Committee Officers**

- Must be after the Primary Election
- Must be a Delegate to the County/SD Convention
- Officers
  - Temporary Convention Chairman
    - ➤ County Convention County Chairman is automatically the Temporary Chair of a COUNTY Convention
    - ▼ SD Convention − Precinct Chairs who live in that SD elect the Temporary SD Convention Chair from amongst themselves
  - Temporary Convention Secretary
    - **▼** May appoint assistants if necessary
  - Temporary Sergeant-at-Arms
    - **▼** May appoint assistants if necessary
  - Temporary Parliamentarian

### **Appoint Temporary Committee Members**

- May be done in consultation with Temporary Committee Chairman
- Must be after the Primary Election but before the County/SD Convention
- Must be a <u>DELEGATE</u> to the County/SD Convention
- Appoint an odd number of members to each committee to avoid tie votes
  - o If your County/SD Convention has more than 25 delegates
    - ➤ Each committee shall be composed of at least 5 members but not more than 15

# **Temporary Committees & Function**

- <u>Temporary Credentials</u> shall hear any contest concerning delegates and shall recommend the permanent roll of the convention
  - This committee checks to ensure that all delegates whose names are submitted did vote in the Republican Primary Election or have taken the Oath of Affiliation
- <u>Temporary Rules</u> shall recommend supplementary rules for the convention
  - Set additional rules concerning time limits, as long as they do not conflict with State Law or Republican Party of Texas Rules
- <u>Party Organization</u> shall recommend permanent officers for the County/SD Convention from among the delegates
  - Often the committee will simply recommend the temporary officers to be permanent officers

## **Temporary Resolutions**

- <u>Temporary Resolutions</u> shall conduct preliminary deliberations for the purpose of making recommendations to the Permanent Resolutions Committee
  - With all the precincts submitting resolutions for consideration the committee combines and organizes these down to be put before the body for debate and possible adoption
  - The resolutions submitted through this process help form the State Party Platform
    - **▼** It is not necessary to pass planks of the current RPT platform
    - ➤ Some counties do use it to help organize the submitted resolutions and show delegates how those resolutions would impact the current State Platform

# **Temporary Nominations**

- <u>Temporary Nominations</u> shall conduct preliminary deliberations for the purpose of making recommendations to the Permanent Nominations Committee
  - This committee compiles a list of eligible Delegates and Alternates to represent the County/SD at the State Convention
  - Eligibility Requirements
    - **▼** Must have voted in the 2022 Republican Primary Election
    - ➤ Or affiliated with the Republican Party
  - Depending on size some counties ask interested individuals to fill out an application and may even offer opportunities to vet individuals in face-to-face interviews

### Guidelines



- Each Precinct is allotted a certain percentage of delegates depending on the turnout in the 2018 election
- Unless all delegates are present each delegate's vote will be a percentage
  - **x** 20 delegates allowed with 10 in attendance = 2 votes per delegate

# State Convention



## Guidelines



- Each County/SD is allotted a certain percentage of delegates depending on the turnout in the 2018 election

- Selection Process
  - SREC nominate to State Chair.
    - ▼ SREC agree automatic appointment
    - ▼ SREC disagree State Chair chooses between the recommendations
    - ▼ SREC does not recommend anyone State Chair appoint anyone

  - \*\*State Nominations\*\*



- State Nominations
  - Carries the vote of the SD to the state committee for:
    - **x** State Chair
    - **x** State Vice Chair


